The role of street medics and how you can assist participants in a medical emergency

Understanding the Good Samaritan Law and legal considerations

Emergency planning before, during, and after actions

Adult First Aid* for common protest injuries, including trauma,

burns, bleeding control, heat exhaustion, sprains, allergic reactions,

breathing emergencies, and chemical exposure

Triage and patient assessment under challenging conditions

Teamwork, buddy systems, and scene safety for effective response
